Coffee-room layout – studio setup

- There will be just these few individuals - about as many to complete a fine quorum for an eclectic conversation.
- The roundtables arranged in a way that all participants are able to comfortably converse, have coffee, and are visible and audible to everyone in the room.
- There will be a podium for a few addresses and felicitations, although the conversations will unfold around the tables mainly.
- There will be 2-3 cameras static as well as moving around the room to capture the footage for each episode.

- If you have been at the earlier editions, you already know that it is not a conference, seminar, workshop, or a large forum - here, it's about having meaningful conversations over coffee conversations that one will take back with them.
- We will continue to follow the notso-formal conversations format.

10 Years of CSR in India – Perspectives and the Path Ahead

It's nearly 10 years since India became the first country in the world to mandate corporate social responsibility (CSR). This provided an additional (and much-needed) impetus to development and environmental programmes – these had an infusion of nearly a trillion rupees in the last decade.

As big as this figure may be (and it is), it is still a minuscule amount when compared to the country's budgets for the mammoth welfare schemes run by the government and can only somehow complement and/or supplement the government's efforts.

This particular conversation round sets the context for the day's theme and remains at the core of all conversations that follow.

- What really has been achieved in the last decade in terms of corporates' capacity to implement and support social and environmental programmes?
- What are the programmes that really worked (maybe also the ones that did not) and have the capacity to be scaled up for more impact?
- How does the next decade look like intervention areas that may speed up the progress being made towards achieving the SDGs.
- Will we see more corporate-government and corporatecorporate partnerships for a larger impact?
